Tap	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Leotard with tights - Leotard with skirt, shorts, or leggings - Shirt tucked into athletic pants or shorts 	<p>Beginner: Shiny black Mary Jane style tap shoes.</p> <p>Intermediate/Advanced: Oxford black tap shoes.</p>	Pulled back and off the face.
Acrobatics	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Leotard, unitard with shorts or leggings - Form fitting shirt, shirt tucked into athletic shorts or leggings 	<p>Acrobatics: Barefoot</p>	Pulled back and off the face.
